CITYOF PHILADELPHIA TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF BIDDING AND CONTRACT

1. INDEMNIFICATION.

All bidders shall indemnify, defend and hold hamness the City, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all obsess, costs (including, but not limited to, litigation and settlement costs and counsel feas), claims, suits, actions, damages, liabilities and expenses, occasioned wholly or in part by the bidder's act or omission or fault or negligence or the act or omission or fault or negligence of bidder's agents, subcontractors (including asppliers), employees or servents in connection with the Contract, including, but not limited to, those acts or omissions or faults or negligence in connection with loss of life, bodily injury, personal injury, damage; to properly, contamination or adverse effects on the environment, the bidder's default under the Contract, intentional acts, failure to pay subcontractors and suppliers and any infringement or violation of any proprietary right (including, but not limited to, patent, copyright, trademark, service mark and trade secret). This obligation to indemnify, defend and hold harmiess the City, its officers, employees and agents shall survive the termination of the Contract.

2. DEFAULT and TERMINATION.

The City shall notify Contractor in writing of such termination, which shall be effective as of the date specified in the notice of termination (the "Termination Date"). The Procurement Contractor of termination Date"). The Procurement Contractor to continue to furnish all goods and perform all services required under the Contract until the Termination Date, in which case, subject to the remarkless enumerated above, the successful bidder shall be paid in accordance with the Contract therefore. If the City requires Contractor to cure the event(s) of default, or to continue to furnish goods or services until the Termination Date, and Contractor refuses or fails to do so, then such failure shall itself be deemed an event of default under this Section, for which the City may exercise any of its rights hereunder.

TAX MATTERS

3. TAX EXEMPTION,

The City of Philadelphia is exempt from the payment of any federal excise or transportation taxes and any Pennsylvania sales tax. The price bid must be net, exclusive of taxes. The City will not pay any sales taxes imposed on the bidder. The bidder must not include any sales taxes imposed on the bidder fit is costs to be reimbursed by the City. However, when under established trade practice any federal excise tax is included in list prices, bidder may quote the list price and shall show separalely the amoist of the federal tex, either as a flat sum or as a percentage of the list price, which shall be deducted by the City. In the event bidder pays any sales or use tax, bidder hereby assigns to City, or City's agent, all of its rights, title and interest in any sales or use tax which may be refunded as a result of the purchase of any articles furnished in connection with the Contract and bidder, unless directed by the City, shall not fite a claim for any sales or use tax refund subject to this assignment. Bidder authorizes the City, in City's name or the name of bidder; to fite a claim for refund of any seles or use tax subject to this assignment.

4. TAX INDEBTEDNESS.

The City of Philadelphia does not wish to do business with tax delinquents or other businesses indebted to the City. In furtherance of this policy, in furtherance of this policy, the following certifications have been developed and shall form a part of any contract result from the Participaling Addendum.

a. Contractor's Certification of Non-indebtedness-Contractor

hereby cartifies and represents that Contractor and Contractor's parent company(les) and subsidiary(les) are not currently indebted to the City of Philadelphia (the "City") and will not at any time during the term of this Contract (including any extensions or renewals thereof) be indebted to the City, for or on account of any delinquent taxes (including, but not limited to, taxes collected by the City on behalf of the School District), items, judgments, fees or other debts for which no written agreement or payment plan selisfactory to the City has been established. In addition to any other rights or remedies available to the City at law or in equity, Contractor acknowledges that any breach or failure to conform to this carification may, at the option of the City, result in the withholding of payments otherwise due to Contractor and If such breach or failure is not resolved to the City's satisfaction within a reasonable time frame specified by the City in writing, may result in the offset of any such indebledness against said payments and/or the termination of this Contract for default (in which case Contractor shall be table for all costs, tosses and other damages resulting from the lemination).

b. Subcontractor's Certification of Non-Indebtedness — Contractor shall require all subcontractors performing work in connection with this Contract ("subcontractor shall also include suppliers providing goods or materials) to be bound by the following provision, and Contractor shall cooperate fully with the City in exercising the rights and remedies described below or otherwise available at law or in equity:

"Subcontractor hereby certifies and represents that subcontractor and subcontractors parent company(ies) and subsidiary(les) are not currently indebted to the City of Philadelphia ("City"), and will not all any time during the ferm of Contractor's Contract with the City (the "Contract"), including any extensions or renewals thereof, be indebted to the City, for or on account of any delirquent taxes (including, but not limited to, taxes collected by the City on behalf of the School District of Philadelphia), liens, judgments, lees or other debts for which no written agreement or payment plan satisfactory to the City has been established. In addition to any other rights or remedies available at law or in equity, subconfractor acknowledges that any breach of or fallure to conform to this certification may, at the option of the City, result in the withholding of payments otherwise due to subcontractor for services rendered in connection with the Contract and, if such breach or faiture is not resolved to the City's satisfaction within a reasonable time frame specified by the City in writing, may result in the offset of any such indebtedness against said payments otherwise due to subcontractor and/or the termination of subcontractor for default (in which case subcontractor shall be liable for all costs, losses and other damages resulting from the lermination) *

S. TAX REQUIREMENTS.

Any person or entity that bids on and/or is awarded a contract by the City and/or School District of Philadelphia, is subject to Philadelphia's business tax ordinances and regulations.

a. The City Solicitor has determined that anyone who is awarded a contract by the City and/or School District pursuant to a bid has entered into a contract within the City, and the subsequent delivery of goods into the City or performance of services within the City constitutes doing business in the City and subjects the contractor, including but not limited to, one or more of the following taxes:

The contractor, if not already paying the aforesaid taxes is required to apply to the Department of Revenue, 1401 John F. Kennady Bivd., Public Service Concourse, Municipal Services Building, Philadelphia, PA 19102 for a tax identification number and to file appropriate business as termings as provided by law. - 6. Orders Against Contract. Subsequent to contract conformance, purchase orders will be issued at such time that the product and/or service is needed. Such purchase orders will show if delivery is to be made upon receipt of order, or only after notification by the using department.
- a invoices sital be submitted after delivery and acceptance of the product or service by the City. The City does not pay accrued late payment fees and interest. The City altempts to process invoices in a timely manner. Delays can occur because of incomplete or inaccurate invoicing information. To ensure timely payment invoices must include the following:
- (1) The Contractor must submit three (3) copies of the invoice for payment to the receiving department listed on the purchase order after the delivery or service has been completed.
- (2) The invoice must correctly reference the purchase order number, the vendor name, address and Federal Employer identification number.
- (3) Checks will only be made payable to the company name as shown on the purchase order; the invoke must reflect this same company name as the "pay to".
- (4) The invoice must show the quantity and type of item or service and the price.
- (5) The unit of purchase on the invoice must agree with the unit clied on the purchase order. Reference to the specific line item is helpful.

GENERAL INFORMATION

7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.

The Contractor, in performance of the Contract shall comply with, and all goods, services, documents and other materials furnished under the Contract shall conform with, all applicable present and future federal, state or local laws, didinances, executive orders, rules, regulations and all court orders, injunctions, decrees and other official interpretations thereof of any federal, state or local court, administrative agency or governmental body, including the City, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the United States of America (applicable law). Applicable law shall include, without finitiation, there is specific laws referenced in peragraphs 25 through 31 herein and Chapter 17-1700 (Contractors are obligated to pay their subcontractors promptly after Contractor receives payment from the City) and Chapter 17-1800 (Contractor shall couperate with the City in addressing its goal of securing employment for Returning Citizens), Contractor shall maintain during the term of the Contract all licenses, and authorizations required by any applicable law.

8. NONDISCRIMINATION.

a. Any Contract awarded pursuant to the invitation and Bid is entered into under the terms of the Philadelphia House Rule Charter and in its performance, Contractor shall not discriminate nor permit discrimination against any person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, mallonel origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, age or disability. Such discrimination shall constitute an event of default

under this Contract entitling City to terminate this Contract forthwith. This right of termination shall be in addition to any other rights or remedies as provided herein in Section 19 or otherwise available to the City at law or in equity.

b. In accordance with Chapter 17-400 of The Philadelphia Code. Contractor agrees that its payment or reimbursament of membership fees or other expenses associated with participation by its employees in an actual on an employees in an employees in an employment advantage or participation confers an employment advantage or constitutes or results in discrimination with regard to hiring, tenure of employment promotions, terms, privileges or conditions of employment, on the basis of race, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, religion, national origin or encestry, shall constitute an event of detault under this Contract and shall entitle the City to all rights and remedies as provided herein in Section 19 or otherwise available to the City at law or in equity. Contractor agrees to include the immediately preceding sentence, with appropriate adjustments for the identity of the parties, in all subcontracts which are entered into pursuant to this Contract. Contractor further agrees to cooperate with the Commission on Human Relations of the City of Philadelphia in any manner which the said Commission deems reasonable and necessary for the Commission to carry out its responsibilities under Chapter 17-400 of The Philadelphia Code. Failure to so cooperate shall constitute an event of default under this Contract entitling the City to all rights and remedies as provided herein in Section 19 or otherwise available to line City at law or in equity.

9. ETHICS REQUIREMENTS.

To preserve the integrity of City employees and maintain public confidence in the competitive bidding system, the City intends to vigorously enfonce the various ethics laws as they relate to City employees in the bidding and execution of City contracts. Such laws are in three categories:

- a. Giffa, Executive Order No. 10-16 prohibits City employees from soliciting or accepting anything of value from any person or entity seeking to initiate or maintain a trusiness relationship with the City of Philadelphie, its departments, boards, commissions, and agencies. Bidder understands and agrees that if it offers anything of value to a City official or employee under circumstances where the receipt of such item would violate the provisions of this Executive Order shall be subject to sanctions with respect to future City Contracts. Such sanctions may range from disqualification from participation in a particular Contract to debarment, depending on the nature of the violation. All bidders, agents or intermediates who are solicited for gifted or gratuities by City employees are urged to report these incidents to the inspector General, Aramark Towar, Third Floor, 1101 Market Street, Philadelphia, PA 19107.
- b. City Employee Interest in City Contracts. In accordance with Section 10-1112 of The Philadelphia Home Rule Charter, no bid shall be accepted from, or Contract swarded to, any City employee or official, or any firm in which a City employee or official has a direct or indirect financial interest. All bidders are required to disclose any current City employees or officials who are employees or officials of the bidder's firm, or who otherwise would have a financial interest in the Contract.
- c. Conflict of interest. Both the State Ethics Act and the City Ethics Code prohibit a public employee from using his/her public office or any confidential information gained thereby to obtain financial gain for himself/herself a member of his/her immediate family, or a business with which he/she

or a member of his/her immediate family is associated. "Use of public office" is avoided by the employee or official publicly disclosing the conflict and disqualifying himselfiherself from official action in the matter, as provided in The Philadelphia Code Saction 20-608.

10. NORTHERN IRELAND, IRAN of SUDAN.

Section 17-104(4)(a) and (b) of The Philadelphia Code prohibits the City from accepting bids from companies that do business in Northern Ireland, tran and Sudan unless, in the instance of Northern Ireland, that business has implemented the fair employment principles ambodized in the MacBride Principles or in the instance of Iran or Sudan, there exists a federal override or the business is excluded from disqualification as described in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007. In furtherance of this ordinance, bidder makes the following certification and representations:

a. In accordance with Section 17-104 of the Philadelphia Code, bidder by execution of its bid certifies and represents that (i) bidder (including any parent company, subsidiary, exclusive distributor, or company affiliated with Bidder) does not have, and will not have at any time during the term of any Contract resulting from this bid (including any extensions thereof), any investments, licenses, franchises, management agreements or operations in Northern (reland, Iran and Sudan and (ii) no product to be provided to the City under any resulting Contract will originate in Northern Ireland, Bidder has implemented the fair employment principles embodied in the MacBride Principles or in the Instance of Iran or Sudan, there exists a federal eventue or the Bidder is excluded from disquestrication as described in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007. In addition to any office remedies reserved under this Bid and Contract, any faise certification by Bidder is subject to the penelties stated in Section 17-104 (c) 3) which include relinquishment of any Bid Security, termination of the Contract and inaligibility for future bids.

11. DISCLOBURES: SLAVERY ERA RECORDS, and FEMALE EXECUTIVES

in accordance with Philadelphia Code Section 17-104 (2), the successful bidder, after award of the Contract, will complete an affidavit certifying and representing that the bidder (including any parent company, subaldiary, exclusive distributor or company affiliated with bidder) has searched any and all records of the bidder or any predecessor business entity regarding records of investments or profits from slavery or slaveholder insurance policies during the slavery era. The names of any slaves or slaveholders described in those records must be disclosed in the efficavit.

The contractor expressly understands and agrees that any false certification or representation in connection with this disclosure and/or any failure to comply with these requirements shall constitute a substantial breach of this Contract entiting the City to all rights and remedies provided in this Contract or otherwise available in law (including, but not limited to. Section 17-104 of The Philadelphila Coda) or equity and the Contract will be deemed voldable. In addition, it is understood that false certification or representation is subject to prosecution under Tale 18 Pa.C.S.A. Section 4994.

- 12. MINIMUM WAGE & BENEFITS AND PREVAILING WAGE.
- if this bid is for the furnishing of services, except where services are incidental to the delivery of supplies for

equipment, it is subject to Chapter 17-1300 of The Philadelphia Code and Mayoral Executive Order 03-14 which establish minimum benefits (health benefits and sick leave) and wages for employees. If Contractor and Contractor's first tier subcontractor(s) furnishing services to the City meet the definition of "Employer," as set forth in Philadelphia Code Sections 17-1302(5) and 17-1303, each shall comply with the minimum wage and benefits provisions established by these laws: from May 20, 2014 through December 31, 2014, the minimum wage shall be \$10.88 per hour, on January 1, 2015, the minimum wage shall be \$12.00 per hour, which wage amount shall be salusted annually thereafter, by the CPI Multiplier.* Contractor and its first tier subcontractor(s) shall notify each affected employee what wages are required to be paid. Accordingly, Contractor by submission of its Bid. acknowledges and certifies its compliance with Chapter 17-1300 and Executive Order 03-14 and shall also require its first tier subconfractors to likewise certify and acknowledge their compliance. Contractor shall promptly provide to the City, at its request, all documents and information varifying its compliance and its first ther subcontractor(s)" compliance with these laws. Any nequest for a partial or total waiver of these requirements must be based on specific stipulated reasons elaborated in Philadelphia Code Section 17-1304 and should be directed to the attention of the Office of Labor Standards within the City's Managing Director's Office (MDO). Fallure to comply with these provisions absent an approved waiver or partial waiver, is an event of default under the Contract and shall also subject Contractor and its first tier subcontractor(s) to the enforcement provisions in Philadelphia Code Section 17-1312.

b. The following services require the payment of prevailing wages and submission of certified payroli records under Philadelphia Code Section 17-107 for compansation that exceeds \$200,000.: landscaping; building care and maintenance; custodial/jankontal housekeeping; security guard service; demolition; snow removal; stucco; noof capping; furniture moving; locking systems and repairs; mechanical/HVAC maintenance and repairs; elevators, escalators, and electrical maintenance and repair, and subcontracts of all or a portion of such contracts. In addition, building service contracts for compensation exceeding \$100,000, are also subject to Section 17-107.

The CPI Multiplier shall be calculated by the Director of Finance for bids issued on or after Jenuary 1 of each year by dividing the most recently published Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI – U) All Items Index. Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as of January of such year, by the most recently published CPI – U as of January 1, 2015.

13. PROTECTION OF DISPLACED CONTRACT WORKERS:

If this bid is for the furnishing of the following services, Security, Janilonal, Building Maintenance, Food and Beverage, Hotel or Non-Professional Health Care Services, then this bid is subject to the "Protection of Displaced Contract Workers" Law, Chapter 9-2300 of the Philadelphia Code; The successful Bidder, if it is a Successor Contractor is required, among other things, to retain certain service employees of the Predecessor Contractor for a ninety-day period.

14. EQUAL BENEFITS.

If this is a Service Contract, as defined in Philadelphia Code Section 17-1901(4), for an amount in excess of \$250,000, Contractor shall, for employees providing services under the Service Contract who reside in the City or employees who

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are non-residents subject to City wage tax under Philadelphia Code Section 19-502(b), extend the same employment benefits the Contractor extends to spouses of its employees to life partners of such employees. By submission of its Bid, Contractor so acknowledges and certifies its compliance with Chapter 17-1900 of the Philadelphia Code and shall notify its employees of the employment benefits available to life partners pursuant to Chapter 17-1900. Following the award of a contract subject to Chapter 17-1900 and prior to execution of the contract by the City, Contractor shall certify that its employees have received the required notification of the employment benefits available to life partners and that such employment benefits will actually be available, or that the Contractor does not employees.

Contractor's failure to comply with the provisions of Chapter 17-1900 or any discrimination or retailation by the Contractor against any employee on account of having claimed a violation of Chapter 17-1900 shall be a material breach the Service Contract.

15. Protected Health Information.

(a) The City of Philadelphia is a "Covered Entity" as defined in the regulations issued pursuant to the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"). The City's business activities include both (1) functions which make the City a Covered Entity, and, therefore, subject to HIPAA, and (2) functions that are not subject to HIPAA. In accordance with 45 CFR \$154.105(a)(2)(iii)(D), the City has designated certain departments and units of the City as health care components that must comply with HIPAA ("Covered Components"). The Covered Components of the City as of August 1, 2013 include: Ambulatory Health Services, a unit of the Philadelphia Department of Public Health ("PDPH"); the Office of Behavioral Health and Intellectual Disability Services; the Philadelphia Nursing Home (a unit of PDPH); the Benefits Administration Unit of the Office of Human Resources; Emergency Medical Services (a unit of the Philadelphia Fire Department), and the Philadelphia Public Health Laboratory (a unit of PDPH). This list is subject to change, and any department or unit of the City that the City in the future determines to be a Covered Component under HIPAA shall be deemed to be a Covered Component to purposes of this Patagraph 32.

(b) To the extent (1) this contract is awarded by the City for or on behalf of a Covered Component and/or requires the parliamence of services that will be delivered to or used by a Covered Component (whether or not the City department or unit through which the City entered the contract is a Covered Component), and (2) Contractor is a "Business Associate" of the City, as defined in 45 GPR §160, 103, Contractor shall comply with the City's Terms and Conditions Relating to Protected Health Information ("City PHI Terms") posted on the City's website (et http://mbeo.phila.gov/procurement/forms/Terms%20Relating%20To%20PHI.pdf). The City PHI Terms are hereby incorporated in this Paragraph 32 as if fully set forth herein. ntly published Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI — U) All Items Index, Philadelphis, Pennsylvania, as of January of such year, by the most recently published CPI— U as of January 1, 2015.
